History

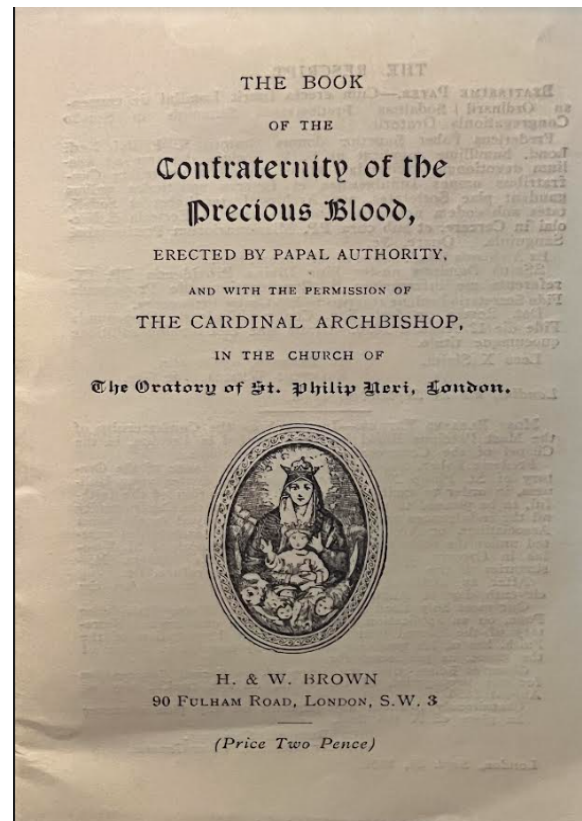
- The Confraternity of the Most Precious Blood in London was erected directly by Pope Pius IX in 1850
- The Confraternity is associated with the Archconfraternity of the Precious Blood which was erected in Rome in the Diaconate of St. Nicola in Carcere
- Pope Pius IX in 1850 grant to the members of the Confraternity all the indulgences enjoyed by the Associations, Archconfraternities and Confraternities in the church of St. Nicola in Carcere
- Members enriched with numerous indulgences (plenary and partial) as also with spiritual favours

- Devotion to the Precious Blood
- United and persistent prayer for:
 - the intention of the Holy Father
 - the foreign missions
 - the conversion of England
 - the welfare of the London Oratory
 - all the intentions spiritual and temporal of the members of the Confraternity
